

Examples of Good and Poor TOC/Abstract Graphics


GOOD GRAPHICS



This graphic has a good balance of images and description. All of the type is crisp and easy to read.




This graphic is simple and appealing.




Appealing use of color and graphs. Even the smallest type is good quality and readable.


POOR GRAPHICS
